Some have rejected these and have suffered the shipwreck of their faith.

1 Timothy 1: 18-19

1 Timothy is one of three books labeled "Pastoral Epistles" (along with 2 Timothy and Titus). Paul wrote this letter to Timothy, a young pastor, in order help him know how he should live and lead the church that God had entrusted to him. In this letter Paul gives him counsel regarding living in purity, appointing elders and deacons, and ensuring proper conduct among church members, as well as a continuing command to teach things in accordance with the Word of God.

In this passage, Paul lays the groundwork for everything he is going to tell Timothy. However, instead of using some of the common (and even biblical) views of pastoral leadership, Paul describes Timothy's calling as to "strongly engage in battle". Literally, Paul is calling Timothy to "fight the fight" or "war the war" (that's actually how the words he uses translate).

How is Timothy supposed to engage in battle? Well, that is the subject of the rest of his letter to Timothy. But the short version is "having faith and a good conscience." Those two things are going to be crucial for Timothy as he declares the Word and leads the church. Who fights through faith and obedience. What is the opposite of faith and good conscience? Doubt and guilt. And a person of God cannot lead when he is compromised by doubt and guilt. In fact, Paul uses a separate analogy to describe the person who has rejected these: a shipwreck. The person who has faith and a good conscience he pictures as a mighty warrior. The person who rejects these is a shipwreck. Their faith is in ruins and therefore they cannot effectively lead the church.

While this letter is primarily towards a young pastor, it is also beneficial for every church member. In all things we should strive to be people of faith and clear conscience. We should seek to serve and to lead the church. But we must have faith that God is who He says He is and will act how He promised, and we must be people who strive to keep a clear conscience, guarding ourselves against sin. We must be willing to "fight the fight" as we serve him through faith and obedience.

"The King Is In the Room"

Some may recognize the title of this article as the title of the song as the Call to Worship in our service on Sunday, June 29. While that's true, my intent is not to talk about a song, but rather the message this song talks about. Let's dive in.

I'd like to start by talking a little bit about my motivation for using that song. My hope always is that when we come together as the people of God, as Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church, or at least those present in the room (or our media) on any given Sunday morning, that we have a life-changing encounter with the God of creation, our Savior Jesus Christ.

I've said and heard it said by others that when you truly come into the presence of God, you will be changed. We are told in Mt. 18:20 - "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." So, I ask you, if you were to stand in the presence of Almighty God and declare your allegiance, dedication to, and love for Him, how could you walk away without being changed? I ask that, and yet, I believe that every week, many of those gathered somehow manage to do so.

How does that happen? And even while I ask that, I must confess that I have been that person more times than I'd want to admit. I'd rather it not be so, but it is, so I have to ask why, and what can we (I) do to help lessen the likelihood of that happening.

Here are two ways I've seen other churches attempt to address this issue.

- 1. As you enter the worship center (sanctuary), they have placed various scripture passages or phrases to remind or encourage you to prepare your heart for worship. I've considered incorporating that concept in some way.
- 2. At some churches and worship concert venues, the room (or at least the platform) is filled with fog. I choose to think that they do so to emulate scripture that describes what happens when God is present. Ezekiel 10:4 for example: "Then the glory of the Lord rose from above the cherubim and moved to the threshold of the temple. The cloud filled the temple, and the court was full of the radiance of the glory of the Lord." Or in the transfiguration in Matthew 17:5 "While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!" Would we be in error to do so? While I have no intention of doing so, I don't think so, with the correct motivation (as stated above) and not just to make the spotlights and lasers look cool.

I know there are more.

- Here at JHBC, we provide a new passage for you to meditate on throughout the week. Hopefully that is helpful.
- The way our Sunday morning schedule works, many of those who walk into the worship service have spent the last hour or so delving into God's Word and discussing what it means and how we can better apply it to our lives. That's a great way to come prepared.
- As I drive to church on Sunday morning, I will typically turn my radio on in my car to K-Love the Christian station that plays worship music throughout the day. That's a good help to me
- I'm guessing that there are those who may be preparing for Sunday School or what-ever role they play on Sunday morning on Saturday evening. I've heard that the last thing you were thinking about when you go to sleep is the first thing you think about when you wake up. If that happened to be the things of God, then that's a great way to begin your Sunday morning.

My desire is that you recognize the unique opportunity we have when we come together at 11:00 AM each Sunday morning. GOD IS HERE. Don't waste the opportunity to worship with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. Engage with Him. Do your best to sing the songs to Him. Encourage those around you with your worship. Come with a soft heart, open to His revelation for your life. Then you can say you met with the King.



Deacon's Corner -August 2025

The July Deacons' meeting was called to order by James Alverson, chairman of the Deacons. Deacons were present along with Pastor Brian. John Hall presented a wonderful devotion on "Justification, Sanctification, and Glorification". Justification meaning you are Justified as a follower of Christ. You have put your faith and trust in him and are recognized as such. Sanctification meaning you are on your journey with fellow believers until Glorification when you are called home to be with Christ. The word Sanctification stuck with me though, about the journey that we are all on and it raised a question.

Does God Give Second Chances when you are supposed to be a follower of Christ?

I believe so because the bible tells us in Luke 17:4 (NIV) "Even if they sin against you seven times in a day and seven times come back to you saying "I repent," you must forgive them." This, in my eyes takes an awfully big person, or maybe someone that knows all too well the importance of forgiveness.

God's desire is to take you from where you are today, and bring you to where he wants you to be. We as Christians are always a work in progress and remember, no one is perfect.

But go, tell His disciples and Peter that He is going ahead of you into Galilee.

There you will see Him, just as he told you.

Mark 16:7 (NIV)

Does God give second chances to those who have failed Him? He certainly did so for Peter. Peter had proudly announced that he was Jesus' most reliable disciple. Matt. 26:33 (NIV) Peter replied, even if all fall away on account of you, I never will. "Truly I tell you, Jesus answered, this very night, before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times." Peters' confidence in himself was overflowing at this point but yet Peter not only fled with the other disciples in that moment of crisis, but also blatantly denied he even knew Jesus.

Matt. 26:69–75(NIV) Now Peter was setting out in the courtyard, and a servant girl came to him. "You also were with Jesus of Galilee," she said. But he denied it before them all. "I don't know what you're talking about," he said. Then he went out to the gateway, where another servant girl saw him and said to the people there, "This fellow was with Jesus of Nazareth." He denied it again, with an oath: "I don't know the man!" after a little while, those standing there went up to Peter and said, "Surely you are one of them; your accent gives you away." Then he began to call down curses, and he swore to them, "I don't know the man!" Immediately a rooster crowed. Then Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken: "Before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times." And he went outside and wept bitterly.

Peter failed so miserably that he went out into the night and wept bitterly because of all his failures before Christ. But how compassionate the risen Christ was to Peter! The angel gave the women at the tomb special instructions to let Peter know that He was risen. Jesus also took Peter aside to allow him the opportunity to reaffirm his love and commitment. The risen Lord also chose Peter as his primary spokesman on the day of Pentecost, when three thousand people were added to the church.

God's desire is to take you from where you are and bring you to where He wants you to be. When He found his defeated followers hiding together in an upper room, Jesus' first word was "peace." John 20:19-20 (NIV) On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

Jesus' first words to you after you fail may also be "peace." Jesus will find you in despair and bring you peace. Then, he will reorient you to himself so that you can believe him and follow him. Don't give up if you have failed your Lord, remember what happened to Peter. God has not yet finished developing you as a disciple for him. As Jesus so eloquently said "Peace be with you!" Christ knows the importance of forgiveness more so than we can ever imagine. This is why the scriptures are filled with words of encouragement and peace, so when we find ourselves in a position of needing forgiveness or having to forgive someone, ask yourself how great was it for Christ to forgive you?

The Deacon body continued with our regular business meeting, pertaining to staff reports, financial updates, ministry contacts, and outreach reports. We discussed our upcoming meetings on July 13, and the 27 th. Looking ahead, the next deacon meeting will be held August 4, 2025. In closing, remember, we are all on that road together to meet Justification, and work on our Sanctification to someday meet with Christ for our reward of Glorification. Help as many people as you can along that winding roadway!


