"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; a light has dawned on those living in the land of darkness." Isaiah 7: 2

When I was young, growing up in New England, one of the very real possibilities each winter was the possibility of losing power. When we lost power, it was sometimes due to wind, or a falling tree. But most of the time it was when we would have an ice storm. The freezing rain would land on the power lines and instantly freeze. As the storm continued, more and more ice would gather on the power lines, adding an incredible amount of weight to the line, eventually causing it to fall, leaving neighborhoods without power.

I actually thought it was kind of cool when we lost power. It added some excitement. But that was only because I didn't understand the danger of losing power in the winter. I didn't know the danger of not having a secondary heat source (we had a generator), or flashlights ready to go, or food that didn't need to be cooked. I took for granted the fact that we were ok during those power outages, only because my parents had prepared for them.

Now as a father we prepare our family for those types of outages. Even though we live in the South where cold is not nearly as serious a threat, we still plan for the darkness. We know where there are flashlights, batteries, and battery packs to recharge our phones. We prepare so that, if the darkness comes, we will be ready.

As we enter the season of Advent, leading up to Christmas, we are reminded of the spiritual darkness before Christ. In Isaiah 59, Isaiah spoke of people "walking in darkness," not physical darkness, but spiritual darkness. He speaks of the lack of justice and righteousness and that even though they desire the light, it is far from them.

But God speaks of the coming hope in Isaiah 7. He says that "the people walking in darkness have seen a great light." This light would be the Messiah. John would describe the Christ saying, "Life was in Him, and that life was the light of men. That light shines in the darkness, yet the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:4-5).

Isaiah prophesied of the hope that would come to the people of God, specifically, in an age of darkness, the light would come in the form of the Messiah, Immanuel, "God with us."

As we celebrate Advent and prepare for Christmas, we rejoice in the light that has come into our lives, and we reflect on the many people who still walk in darkness as we seek to reflect God's light into the lives of people who are hurting this Christmas season.

You know how sometimes you're riding in your car, not really paying attention to what's on the radio. But then, some song comes on. Well, I have an idea. In the month of January, I'd like to utilize this concept for good. Each Sunday in January, we will read this brief passage of scripture that I hope will take root in your mind, so that whenever you need it or the Holy Spirit wants to bring it to your memory, it's right there, ready to help you.

The passage is Psalm 100. It's only 5 verses, and you will remember it by its four action words and a number (Scott's way of remembering).

Psalm 100

- ¹ **Shout** for joy to the Lord, all the earth.
- ² Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.
- ³ **Know** that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.
- ⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.
- ⁵ **For** the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

My hope is this. On those days that you couldn't find your keys, the alarm clock didn't get turned on, you're walking into work or church, and you just remembered you had volunteered to bring doughnuts. Or it could be the best day ever - it doesn't matter. What's important is that you have something planted in your mind, available to remind you who you are (a child of God), that He knows you intimately and loves you anyway, and that however your day is going, we not only have the great privilege, but are commanded to 'shout for joy to the Lord'.

Oh, and one more thing... "Father Abraham, had many sons..."

Lottie Moon

This is a busy time of year for missions and giving. When we think of the Christmas season, we often think of the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.

While living in China, Lottie wrote letters to the Foreign Mission Board (now the International Mission Board) and to Baptist women. She asked for more missionaries and for money to grow her work among the Chinese. Because of Lottie's determination, WMU collected a Christmas Offering to give to the Foreign Mission Board. In 1918, on Annie Armstrong's suggestion, WMU named the offering for Lottie Moon.

Today, we still give to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering in honor of her work and sacrifice to keep our missionaries on the field. We will begin our celebration of Lottie Moon and our emphasis on International Missions November 30. Our emphasis and collection for the Lottie Moon Offering goes through December 31. The JHBC goal is \$12,000.




