However, that first night in the hospital was a rough one. April and I both stayed in that room and prepared to try to get a good night's sleep. However, as we were preparing to sleep an alarm went off throughout the hospital regarding a "Code White". That alarm went off about every 20 minutes for half the night. In the early morning that alarm was replaced by a new alert saying, "This is **NOT** a code white". This second alarm lasted through the rest of the night, resulting in a very long night and very little sleep for April and me.

As we got home, we were grateful to get some rest. However, we soon found out that Addy had a terrible sleep schedule. She slept all day long (when I was at work) and was up all night. Worse, she would continually cry unless she was being carried. This resulted in me working all day and walking her most of the night, pacing up and down the hallway trying to keep her quiet and giving April some time to sleep before we rotated, and April walked her the rest of the night. I'm not sure if I have ever been more tired than I was in those days before we could get Addy on a sleep schedule.

In this passage, Jesus speaks to a tired people; not necessarily to people lacking in sleep, but to people who were burdened, people who were weighed down with the weights that the world had placed on them. When Jesus spoke to the Pharisees, he rebuked them for their legalism and their abuse towards their own people. But when Jesus spoke to the common people, the people who were drowning in their sin and following Jesus because in Him they saw a glimpse of truth, he was filled with compassion. He spoke to them of a "rest," a concept that the Jewish people were well acquainted with in regard to their "Sabbath rest". When their religious leaders continually burdened them with legalism, Jesus offered them rest.

The New Year is a time of anxiety, stress, and frustration. As we recover from the holidays we try to make up for the money we spend on food, trips, and presents and readjust once again to school and work schedules, it is easy to feel burdened and run down. My prayer for you today is that whatever you're going through, that you will find the rest that comes in the person of Jesus Christ.

During the most recent NC Baptist Singers and Orchestra concert that I participated in, I was struck by the message of one of our most well-loved hymns, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus". It's not that I had never sung the words before, of course I had, many times. But for whatever reason, God chose for me to hear them in a new way at that moment.

Born out of sorrow and love for his mother, who was facing a time of sorrow, Joseph Scriven wrote these words in 1855, never intending for anyone other than her to read them. However, as mothers are keen to do, she shared his message with someone else, which led to it quickly becoming the text to a growing hymn in Ireland.

I invite you to read these words, slowly and somewhere you aren't distracted. See if you, like me, are reminded of the unique and powerful gift we have, to be able to speak with God, who loved us so much that He sent His one and only Son to die in our place, so that we could have this sweet fellowship with Him.

What A Friend We Have in Jesus

Verse 1

What a friend we have in Jesus, All our sins and griefs to bear What a privilege to carry, Everything to God in prayer O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear All because we do not carry, Everything to God in prayer

Verse 2

Have we trials and temptations, Is there trouble anywhere We should never be discouraged, Take it to the Lord in prayer Can we find a friend so faithful, Who will all our sorrows share Jesus knows our every weakness, Take it to the Lord in prayer

Verse 3

Are we weak and heavy laden, Cumbered with a load of care Precious Savior still our refuge, Take it to the Lord in prayer Do thy friends despise forsake thee, Take it to the Lord in prayer In His arms He'll take and shield thee, Thou wilt find a solace there

What do I take away from this? Just a few things.

- 1. Prayer is a blessing from God that we need to take advantage of.
- 2. God doesn't want us to carry our burdens. He will take them away.
- 3. He is a friend that can carry us when we are weak... if we let Him.
- 4. When life is hard, we can find refuge in the arms of God.

It's an interesting thing, how different it is, sometimes, to just read the words of a song that we sing, rather than just sing it. It must use a different part of our brain, or something. Whatever it is, I hope that one thing we take away from this is the importance of knowing and understanding what we sing. It can prove to be a completely different experience and understanding to our heart and mind.

Deacon's Corner

For the last 3 months the deacons have set aside a significant time during our monthly meeting to discuss how God is leading us for future spiritual growth and expansion of his kingdom. We've reflected on the feedback provided by you through congregational survey and discussed what we believed to be our strengths and weaknesses as a congregation as well as what opportunities God may be opening for us in our congregation and community. It is an exciting time to be a part of JHBC and I am looking forward to seeing where God will be leading us.


Discussing strategy is not a topic exclusive to businesses, nor is it new to JHBC. It's a gift given to God's people to look ahead and plan for the future. When I discuss strategy at work, I often refer to Nehemiah's strategy to rebuild the wall in Jerusalem as an example of leadership and strategic planning. When Nehemiah heard that the walls of Jerusalem were still broken down, he was deeply moved and began to formulate a plan. His strategy can be summarized in several key steps:

- 1. **Prayer and Planning**: Nehemiah began by praying and fasting, seeking God's guidance and favor. This spiritual preparation was crucial as it laid the foundation for his subsequent actions.
- 2. **Securing Permission and Resources**: Nehemiah, who held the influential position of cupbearer to the Persian King Artaxerxes, used his position to secure the king's permission to rebuild the walls. He also obtained letters of safe passage and resources such as timber for the construction.
- 3. **Assessing the Situation**: Upon arriving in Jerusalem, Nehemiah conducted a thorough inspection of the walls at night to assess the extent of the damage. This allowed him to develop a realistic and detailed plan.
- 4. **Mobilizing the People**: Nehemiah effectively mobilized the people of Jerusalem, assigning specific sections of the wall to different families and groups. This not only distributed the workload but also fostered a sense of ownership and community.
- 5. **Overcoming Opposition**: Throughout the rebuilding process, Nehemiah faced significant opposition from surrounding enemies. He implemented safety measures, such as stationing guards at vulnerable points and encouraging the workers to be vigilant. Nehemiah's leadership and determination helped the people stay focused and motivated despite the challenges.
- 6. **Completion and Dedication**: The wall was completed in a remarkably short time of 52 days. Nehemiah's strategic planning, effective leadership, and reliance on prayer and community cooperation were key factors in this success.

Nehemiah's story is a powerful example of how strategic planning, combined with faith and community effort, can lead to remarkable achievements.

The deacons ask that you join us in praying for God to reveal His plans for us as we dream about the future of JHBC.




