Last week I had the opportunity to see a fantastic performance of "A Christmas Carol" at the Temple Theater (especially exciting with a couple of our church members participating in the play). But one of the highlights of the show is seeing the contrast between Scrooge at the beginning and him at the end. In the beginning he is a crotchety old man who has sacrificed everything to gain money and would rather see people die then for him to have to deal with them ("If they would rather die," said Scrooge, "they had better do it, and decrease the surplus population.") But by the end he was a good friend, a good master, and a good man, caring even about (and especially for) a crippled young boy who could do nothing for him. We see his fictional example and maintain the hope that people can change.

We find this concept all throughout scripture. Possibly the closest example is the Pharisee Saul who, rather than money, sacrificed everything for self-righteousness. But we also see a king named David brought low by his affair and corresponding murder seek reconciliation with God (Psalm 51), a coward named Gideon made into a "mighty man of God (Judges 6-8), a deceiver named Jacob made into the father and namesake of the Israelite nation. Example after example we see men and women changed as they encounter the one true God.

As we celebrate New Years, our encouragement is that God still changes people. New Years Resolutions have become a joke that rarely lasts past the first few weeks of January. But would you commit yourself to growing closer to God this Christmas season? Would you set aside time to spend in his Word, to memorize a passage of Scripture, to serve in His church, and/or to tell someone about the Gospel of Jesus Christ? Would your deepest prayer be the same as David's: May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, Lord, my rock and my Redeemer."



#### Survive in 2025?

As we were wrapping up 2024, I had a question to ponder... We had "Pray More in 2024" here at JHBC, but we couldn't just go

How many times is prayer our first response? I will be the first to admit that, even as one of your pastors, I can sometimes view prayer as my "survival mode", only running to it when things seem hopeless and finally beyond my control.

I know, that's wrong, and it may seem shocking for you to hear. But recently, God has really been showing Heather and I some things that we need to rely on Him for... but we need to bring it to Him in prayer. We need to pray over it, turn it over to Him, and trust that He has it under control. I don't know about you, but when I really get the opportunity to think about that, it is so freeing! Realizing that God is in control of every situation in our lives frees us up so much from fear and worry. When we cling to Him, we can move from merely surviving day by day, and truly thriving in the will of God for us.

What would it take for us to Thrive in 2025? What areas of our lives do we need to fix so that we can go from simply surviving to totally thriving? Do we need to work on our prayer lives? Do we need to get back into His Word? Do we need to make worship a rhythm of our lives, rather than an event we attend? What small habit-forming actions can we take today that will bring us an inch closer to Thriving in Christ each day?

Let's lean into God this year, and learn to Thrive in 2025!

#### Leadership Lessons from the Past

The first few weeks in January is always an interesting time of year. Many of us have jumped into the New Year full of intentions to make positive changes, both small and large. Health goals, professional goals, and everything in between. The promise of new and different is in the air and it feels good.

At the same time... I don't know about you, but after the holidays I still have this nagging desire to simply live in the same 'ol, same 'ol. 2024 is gone, but 2025 isn't fully operational just yet. It's a weird space. Part of us wants to sprint towards the future and the other part wants to stay where it is comfortable. Maybe you do too...

One thing that I have learned over the years is that sometimes simply remembering the past can be a powerful motivator. Scripture reminds us as well in Romans 15:4,

"For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope".

I firmly believe there is tremendous value in taking a strategic pause, especially for anyone in a leadership role. In a world where responsibilities are always added to your plate, slowing down in order to go fast is essential. It creates space for intentional actions.

So let me share a few of the lessons I have learned from reflecting on this past year...

- 1. Run your own race. Looking around at others only diverts your focus and direction.
- 2. Minimize unhealthy escapism. Maybe its social media, sports, the kids or grandkids... maybe its simply withdrawing in an effort to make it all go away... Remember, leaders run toward problems, not away.
- 3. Tell the Story. It helps connect and create clarity. Leaders take note: a good story, especially one that is personal, can inspire those around you... especially when that story comes from the pages of Scripture.
- 4. No one has it all figured out. And I mean no one! Despite what you see on the outside, every person is dealing with their own demons or insecurities. This leads back to lesson #1.
- 5. Put back your shopping cart. Don't leave in the middle of the parking lot.. The little things matter now more than ever. Small acts of kindness and leaving things better than how you found them make a difference to our world. Do your part in taking care of this place, your company, our church and each other.

Here's to what 2024 taught you and what lies ahead in 2025!










