They do not perceive the Lord's actions, and they do not see the work of His hands.

Therefore My people will go into exile because they lack knowledge. Isaiah 5: 12-13

As I write this article, I am sitting on my bunk at youth camp at Ft. Caswell. We just completed our first night of worship. The speaker spoke from Isaiah 5 and then we had our church group devotions. During our devotions, Nick asked all the youth and chaperones to write down a goal that we have for this week. What do we hope to accomplish? Or, more specifically, what do we want to see God do this week at camp?

I thought carefully about what my goals for the week should be. I wrestled with it for a few minutes before writing two goals one that has to do with my spiritual walk with Him, and the other having to do with how I would love to see God work in the lives of the youth.

However, tonight as I meditate on this passage, I think about the many times that I have seen God work in my life and in the lives of those around me. I think of the countless prayers I have prayed and simply forgotten about. I think of the many times God has shown Himself faithful in my life that are not forgotten to the past.

God's message through Isaiah to the people of Israel is a message of condemnation. And while the Israelites had committed many sins against their God, their primary sin (and the root cause of all the others) is the sin of forgetfulness.

God accuses them of sinning against Himself, less because they have a spirit of rebellion and more because they have forgotten all the many ways that God has worked for them. It would be hard to sin against God when we are constantly meditating on how good He has been to us. It is hard to sin against Him when we focus on His faithfulness in our lives. It is hard to sin against Him when we are completely consumed with praising Him for His acts of love and mercy.

So why do we sin against Him? Because we are a forgetful people. We are so caught up in the present, that we forget about His faithfulness in the past. That is why Isaiah describes the Israelites as being sent "into exile because they lack knowledge." He was not referring to the scholarly studies or their literacy. He was saying that they had forgotten how faithful and merciful God had been to them in the past. And this forgetfulness is what has led the Israelites to sin.

As we continue to pursue Him, let us strive to remember His faithfulness in our lives. And let us strive for holiness with a thankful heart for all that He has done in the past.
