James 1: 5-8

Over the last month, our staff devotions each Wednesday have been reading through the book of Proverbs. The common theme through the book of Proverbs is the importance of wisdom, often personified as a person. Solomon writes in Proverbs 2: 1-6,

"My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my commandments with you, making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding; yes, if you call out for insight and raise your voice for understanding, if you seek it like silver and search for it as for hidden treasures, then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God. For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.

The whole point of the book of Proverbs is to lead people to seek Wisdom. Unfortunately, this is becoming rare. We see people all over the news, internet, schools, and the workplace who are filled with knowledge, but have no use for wisdom.

However, throughout the book of Proverbs, knowledge and wisdom are connected. In fact, if you read the book of Proverbs, it is hard to imagine one without the other. If you truly care about wisdom, you must seek knowledge. And if you truly care about knowledge, you must seek wisdom. Look for example at Proverbs 1:7, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction."

This is not solely an Old Testament concept. James tells us that we should ask God for wisdom. After all, "For the Lord gives wisdom." But James takes it a step further. Not only is God the source of wisdom, but He WANTS us to have wisdom. If we ask, it will be given to us (James 1:5). If we lack wisdom, it is because we do not ask for it, or because we seek it in places other than in God, the source of all wisdom.



WORSHIP MATTERS

You know, they say you can't believe everything you see on the internet. And believe me, that's true! But there are some unique exceptions every once in a while. I found a great recipe for shrimp and grits the other day. I tried it out, using a little of my own creativity, and it turned out great! Just ask Ann! She ate it and didn't even get sick!

And just today, I found another great example. You outdoorsmen, do you remember Jimmy Houston? And for those who don't recognize him by name, let me tell you, he is a legendary bass fisherman. Back when bass fishing tournaments started being a thing, this guy was absolutely one of the best! He was even known to kiss a fish right before throwing them back in the water and has a laugh like no other. And for 20 years, Jimmy Houston Outdoors (TV show) consistently ranked as the #1 outdoors show on ESPN.

What many may not know is that Jimmy is a dedicated Christian. He is not afraid to talk about his faith, and has written a number of devotion books, one titled "Catch of the Day", which has a daily devotional, as well as a fishing tip to start each day.

Now, every day, early in the morning, he records a video where he goes over one of those devotions and the fishing tip and puts it on YouTube. I watched it today and thought I'd share a little bit about what he said.

Hebrews 10:24-25 was the passage he focused on. He never read it straight out, but to remind you what it says, I will include it. ²⁴ And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

He says flat out, "You should not stay away from the church meetings. I know a lot of fishermen disagree with this scripture. Sunday afternoon is a good time to go fishing, but you should not stay away from the church meeting, as some are doing, but you should meet together and encourage one another.

One of the reasons we are to meet together is to encourage one another. Can I tell ya? Can I tell ya? God wants us in church to benefit each other. He intends for us to share our problems with those in church. He intends us to share our victories, our triumphs, our pain, also our joy. He has promised to be there when we meet. Whenever two or more meet in my name, I'll be there with you (Mt. 18:20).

Will you benefit from being at church multiple times this week? Absolutely you will, absolutely. Can your presence benefit other people in that church? Well, it should. Your presence should benefit other folks in that church.

Here's what you need to do. Make it a point to encourage as many folks as you can at church this week. Sunday morning, Sunday night, Tuesday, Wednesday, or some sort of special event, make it a point to encourage somebody at church this week. When the week is done, you might just find that you have been encouraged most of all."

He goes on to answer the question he opened the devotional with, "What type reel should you use to learn to skip a lure under docks? A spinning reel, obviously a spinning reel." And he continues on a bit, explaining why. But then he comes back to his real message, "Guys and girls, go out there and have you a great one. Encourage people. You don't have to wait until you get to church, by the way. Encourage everyone you meet today no matter where you are, and like I said, you might find that you have been encouraged most of all."

Well said, Jimmy. Well said. Now about kissing fish...

I enjoyed this article from the Billy Graham archives stating that " Angels Are All Around Us." I hope you'll enjoy it, too.

Angels are real- just as real as you and I are. Although they are largely unseen by us, they exist in great numbers. The Bible speaks of "thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly" (Hebrews 12:22) When Jesus' birth was announced to the shepherds outside Bethlehem, "a great company of the heavenly host appeared...praising God" (Luke 2:13.)

Unlike us, however, angels are spiritual beings - that is, in their normal state they don't have physical bodies. However, on occasion they can appear as ordinary humans, or even as glorious celestial beings that reflect the majesty of God. When God gave the prophet Isaiah a vision of His glory, His throne was surrounded by angels of great splendor and power. "At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook." (Isaiah 6:4)

God created the angels for one purpose: to serve Him. As such they work in hidden ways to carry out God's will and protect God's people. Even when we are unaware of them, they are still part of our lives. They also are part of a great unseen army that constantly fights against Satan and his servants of evil. God's promise should bring comfort to every believer: "He will command HIs angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways." (Psalm 91:11)

We aren't to worship the angels; God alone is worthy of our worship. But we can thank God for them - and some day in Heaven we'll realize just how much they've done for us, at God's command. " Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?" (Hebrews 1:14).

The well-known theologian Karl Barth was asked by a reporter, "Sir, you have written huge volumes about God. Tell me, how do you know it is all true?" According to the story, he answered, "My mother told me."

Lord God, we thank you for our mothers. Help us to love and respect them. Help us to be loving children as well as loving parents and spouses, for your sake. Amen.
