Then the news about Him spread throughout Syria. So they brought to Him all those who were afflicted, those suffering from various diseases and intense pains, the demon-possessed, the epileptics, and the paralytics. And He healed them.

Matthew 4: 23-24

One of the most fascinating things about talking to other Christians is hearing about how they came to know Christ. Because everyone's story is different. How God ministers to each person, what circumstances they were going through, who their primary influencer was, how they heard the Gospel, are different depending on who you talk to. But what is common among each story is that somebody told them the Gospel. It may have been at a camp or retreat. They may have been told by a friend, family member, classmate, or colleague. It may have been in church Sunday morning. But someone took the time to talk to them about Christ.

In Matthew, near the beginning of Jesus ministry, we find Jesus' popularity increasing. People are hearing about the incredible things Jesus can do: that people brought to him are being healed and the incredible message He is delivering. As news about Jesus spread, we find the crowds begin to grow. People are hearing and responding. However, something especially interesting is happening. Not only are people coming to hear Jesus' message and see His miracles, but they are reaching out to their loved ones, their friends and family members, and bringing them to see Jesus. Their message was probably similar to the Samaritan woman at the well in John 4: "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did!" However, their message was "Come see the man heals the sick, casts out demons, and performs miracles." And the people came. However, without someone telling them about Jesus, they would have remained in their sickness, afflictions, demon possession, and lostness. But they had an opportunity to find both healing and salvation because someone told them about the Messiah.

As we continue to worship, we are reminded of a world that is lost. Everywhere we see and hear about people who are searching for hope in a variety of places. And we have been called by God to be a "light" to them, to be messengers of hope. In short, we have been called to say to them "Come, see the man who changed my life, and can change yours too."

WORSHIP MATTERS

While our news feeds are filled with warnings of Hurricane Erin and the possible impact it may have on our coastline (remember, this is being written on Aug. 20), we have a team of 15 JHBC-ers preparing to head to western North Carolina to assist with the deadliest hurricane to ever hit North Carolina.

Spawning six tornadoes, 1,400 landslides, 126,000 homes impacted, and 6,000 miles of roads damaged, as well as more than 107 deaths reported, the destruction caused by Hurricane Helene is unparalleled in our state's history.

Fortunately, Baptists on Mission (BOM) is on the job. Even before disaster struck, they were preparing to serve the people of North Carolina. And ever since,



they have worked tirelessly to minister to those in need, physically and spiritually. Here's an update from BOM on what's happening, in late August.

We are using our Helene donations to purchase building materials that will be used by volunteers to help get families back in their homes (Our goal is 1000 homes this year). More than half the cost of building is labor, but with volunteers providing the labor we can double or even triple the number of families that we can get back in their homes. But even more than that, volunteers are proving a listening ear, a smile, a prayer and encouragement to the family that they are not forgotten. Volunteers provide hope. Baptist disaster relief volunteers have been working since Helene hit. We started with mass feeding, and along with our partners with NC Emergency Management, Red Cross and Salvation army were able to provide almost 500,000 hot meals.

Next came chainsaw jobs, mud-outs and tear outs of homes that had been flooded. Volunteers showed up to tear out flooring and drywall, to stop the spread mold and give encouragement with conversations, smiles and prayers. Over 5000 jobs were completed.

Then we started working to try to help get people back in their homes. As of August 10, 2025, we have completed 433 home rebuilds, we have 248 in progress and we have a total of 1300 rebuild requests. We have 5 rebuild center locations across western NC. Baptists on Mission is operating 5 rebuild sites in western North Carolina to assist those affected by hurricane Helene. We can house, feed and work volunteers from these rebuild centers.

We are trying to get homeowners back into their homes as quickly as possible. We will be working for the next 4-5 years to help with rebuild efforts. You don't need to be trained to serve. We're grateful to the more than 16,000 people who have volunteered since the storm hit our state.

Here's a list of those from JHBC who will be headed to Swannanoa, NC Sept. 7-11 to help in any way that's needed. It is expected that the team will be involved in rebuilding homes, though soon, BOM will begin building new homes from scratch as well. We ask that you keep each of them in your prayers during this time. Pray that they would be safe, that they would accomplish much, and that they have the opportunity to speak the name of Jesus to those whom they're serving. Thank you.



Pray For Our Team



A mission team of 21 people representing five churches in our Sandy Creek Baptist Association traveled to Jonesville, Virginia for the annual shoe fair. This is the 11th year that a team from Sandy Creek Baptist Association has partnered with the Powell River Baptist Association in providing shoes, socks, school supplies, hygiene kits and the love of Jesus Christ to many children and their families in the Jonesville and Lee County area of Virginia. Many churches in our association donated needed items, money and willingly helped in preparation for this mission. WE THANK YOU! Out total count of shoes this year was beyond any we have previously had.... approximately **840** pairs of shoes, hundreds of pairs of socks, **130** Hygiene Kits, 276 School Supply Kits and **115** Book Bags. Included in hygiene bags and the school supply bags were tracks with the plan of salvation.

On Friday, August 1st the main shoe fair was held in the Powell River Association Missions building. Shoes were fitted on **240** children and additional pairs of shoes were given to **154** children. Each child received at least 3 pairs of socks. **100** Families were served.

Our association collected more shoes that we have ever collected, and God had a PLAN! That plan was revealed to us when asked the owner of the restaurant we were at if we could place our flyers about the Shoe Fair on each table....and she immediately said...." Our Children Need Shoes!" This community was 20 miles from Jonesville (Still in Lee County, Virginia) and as she related to us, people didn't go to Jonesville, mainly because they didn't have the means to do so.... but their children needed shoes! From that conversation we were put in contact with the principal at the Elydale Primary School about one mile from the restaurant. The rest is history......

The principal met us at her school, and we delivered 379 pairs of shoes and dozens of socks to the school on Saturday. She emailed us and related that on orientation day they fitted over 200 students with shoes and have sent the remaining shoes to the other two schools (High School and Middle School) in Ewing, Virginia.

NEWS FROM WMU (Women's Missionary Union)

It is still 90 degrees outside, but it is time for us to already be thinking about Christmas and the needs of others. For the ladies of the WMU (and all church members) it is also time to start collecting items for the Red Box Ministry through our state WMU for the women incarcerated in our state women's prison. For many women this is the only Christmas present they receive. We need your help to fill these boxes with basic supplies. JHBC will be collecting shampoo 16-20 oz plastic bottles (NO conditioner in the shampoo, only shampoo and only this size) and lotion 8-11 oz plastic bottles, NO pump bottles. Our goal is to collect 150 bottles of shampoo and 100 bottles of lotion. These items can be found at any dollar store (Dollar Tree, Dollar General, Family Dollar). There will be a red container in the Mission Depot to collect these items. Our collection period is September 1 through October 5.
